In August of 2011 Friends of Youth CEO Joan Campbell retired, concluding 22 years of exemplary service to youth. As she approached her retirement, Joan added her name to the Legacy Circle of the Foundation, providing support to future generations of young people through a legacy gift.

Joan left us too quickly, on November 5, 2014. A year after her death, Tim Williams, Joan's Husband, met with Foundation Chair Phil Crocker and CEO Terry Pottmeyer to share conversations that he and Joan had about Friends of Youth and her legacy gift to the Foundation.
